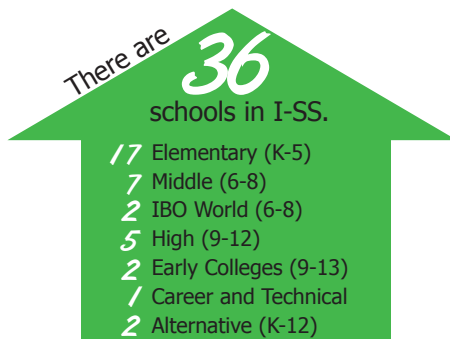
OUR MISSION

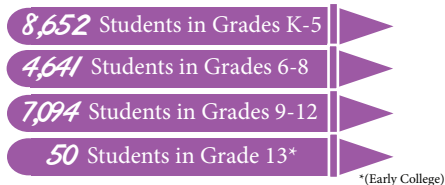

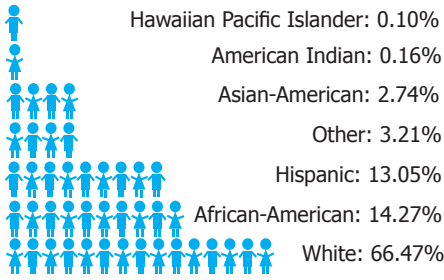

Iredell-Statesville Schools prides itself in their academic success. A few additional highlights are:

- STEM Academies: I-SS established middle school STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) Academies through our Career and Technical Education for students in grades 6-8. (*Fall 2015*)
- ACT WorkReady Community Partnership: I-SS has joined Mitchell Community College, the Greater Statesville Chamber of Commerce, and the Mooresville-South Iredell Chamber of Commerce to pursue accreditation as a community committed to having a 21st Century workforce.
- The addition of the I.B. Career Certification at the Career Academy and Technical School (CATS) in Troutman. Career Certifications include Information Technology, Health Sciences, Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources, Business Management and Administration, Communication and Technology.
- Mount Mourne and Northview IBO World Schools received full accreditation.
- Expansion of the I.B. Diploma Program to South Iredell High School with full accreditation.
- Expansion of the I.B. Primary Years Program to Coddle Creek Elementary School (*candidacy*) for the fall of 2016.
- Expansion of vocational/career training through the Career Academy and Technical School (CATS) in Troutman. Concentrations include Allied Health Services, Automotive Technology, Culinary Arts, Digital Communication, Firefighting, Heavy Equipment and Diesel Technology, Manicuring (*Fall 2016*), and Masonry Training.
- Two successful early college programs: Collaborative College for Technology and Leadership (CCTL) and Crossroads Science and Arts Early College.
- Lakeshore Elementary School scheduled to launch the first elementary education STEM school in the district. (*Fall 2016*)
- Recipient of \$5 million federal i3 grant with required \$1 million private matches (*1 of 7 school districts in the nation*).**
- Recipient of \$20 million federal Race To the Top District grant (*1 of 16 in the nation*).**
- Iredell-Statesville Schools launched the iACADEMY (*the first public school partnership with home schools in North Carolina*).
- Expansion of the Spanish Dual-Immersion Program at East Iredell Elementary School in the Fall of 2015-16.
- Iredell-Statesville Schools received full accreditation as a quality school district by AdvancED.

** I-SS is the only school system in the nation to be recipients of both the i3 and the District Race To the Top grants.

SCHOOL SAFETY

Iredell-Statesville Schools takes student safety seriously. As one of their top priorities, the district maintains partnerships with law enforcement at local and state levels. Iredell-Statesville Schools has enhanced security measures through the installation of camera systems, multi-tiered entrance systems, and having School Resource Officers (SROs) at each of their middle and high school campuses. The district believes in proactive law enforcement and has established Police substations at several campuses to increase visibility and strengthen their relationship with I-SS.

Iredell-Statesville Schools is governed by a 7-member board of education, elected by the voters from each district. Members serve 4-year terms.

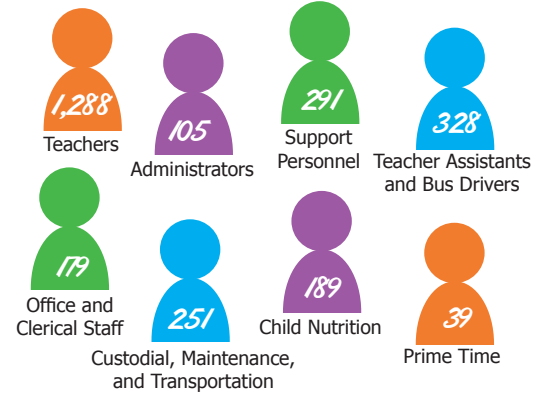
